### Academic Engagement Camp

College Settlement staff will assist students in logging into their distance learning platforms from our open-air building, with social distance and masking protocols in place, while their families can work or seek employment.

We will enable students to review and learn their school district's curriculum through using the Internet, while providing opportunities for socially distanced engagement with peers, personal exploration, and interactions with nature.

The staff will not provide tutoring. Our program is governed by rules that the students and parents will be made aware of and require the students to be responsible and accountable for their own learning with minimal assistance.

Working independently, in small groups, students will be provided with time and space to complete their lessons while being monitored by a supervisor.

A limited number of children, grades 2 through 5, will be enrolled.

### Program Goals

- To serve the community in this uncertain time
- To provide a safe environment for students to learn with their peers through virtual platforms
- To allow parents an opportunity to return to work knowing their child is focusing on schoolwork
- To utilize the open-air space on-site to allow children an opportunity to interact safely and provide much needed social and emotional skills and a connection to our natural world
- To provide an opportunity for physical activity and support mental health



Children's breaks and recesses will include fun (yet socially distanced) indoor and outdoor activities with their peers.

### Kid-Friendly Staff

Our staff typically interact with kids in a fun, outdoor, camp setting and will encourage socially-distant outdoor engagement.

### Open-Air Setting

Our Day Camp Activity Center has 8 garage doors, 12 windows, and numerous ceiling fans to allow fresh air to flow throughout the building.

### Safe Environment

- Staff to child ratio: 1 to 4-5
- Nurse on-site
- All staff and students will adhere to CDC guidelines for masking and sanitizing

## Costs

### 8:45 AM to 3:00 PM (School Time)

- 5 days a week: \$275. a week
- 3 days a week: \$180. a week
- 2 days a week: \$130. a week

### 3:00 to 6:00 PM (Aftercare)

- 5 days a week: \$85. a week
- 3 days a week: \$65. a week
- 2 days a week: \$45. a week

- Pending a Child's learning day, synchronous or asynchronous, our staff will assist in monitoring breaks and allow for safe social interactions and fun. The school day includes Recess, Lunch, and Brain Breaks

Our staff members lead and/or supervise small socially-distanced child groups. Activities will include arts & crafts, sports, movies, nature hikes, team-building games, and more.
